## The Habit of Personal Prayer

The Seven Habits of Growing Christians #4

Series theme verse: 1 Peter 2:2-3 (NIV) Like newborn babies, crave pure spiritual milk, so that by it you may **grow up** in your salvation, now that you have tasted that the Lord is good.

## Developing the three movements of personal prayer:

Psalm 103:1-5 (ESV) <sup>1</sup>Bless the Lord, O my soul, and all that is within me, bless his holy name! <sup>2</sup>Bless the Lord, O my soul, and forget not all his benefits, <sup>3</sup>who forgives all your iniquity, who heals all your diseases, <sup>4</sup>who redeems your life from the pit, who crowns you with steadfast love and mercy, 5who satisfies you with good so that your youth is renewed like the eagle's.



Romans 8:1 (ESV) There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus.

Hebrews 4:15-16 (NLT) This High Priest of ours understands our weaknesses, for he faced all of the same testings we do, yet he did not sin. So let us come boldly to the throne of our gracious God. There we will receive his mercy, and we will find grace to help us when we need it most.

Psalm 26:2 (NLT) Put me on trial, Lord, and cross-examine me. Test my motives and my heart.

Psalm 103:6-18 (ESV) <sup>6</sup>The Lord works righteousness and justice for all who are oppressed. <sup>7</sup>He made known his ways to Moses his acts to the people of Israel. <sup>8</sup>The Lord is merciful and gracious, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love. <sup>9</sup>He will not always chide, nor will he keep his anger forever. <sup>10</sup>He does not deal with us according to our sins, nor repay us according to our iniquities. <sup>11</sup>For as high as the heavens are above the earth, so great is his steadfast love toward those who fear him; <sup>12</sup>as far as the east is from the west, so far does he remove our transgressions from us. <sup>13</sup>As a father shows compassion to his children, so the Lord shows compassion to those who fear him. <sup>14</sup>For he knows our frame; he remembers that we are dust. <sup>15</sup>As for man, his days are like grass; he flourishes like a flower of the field; <sup>16</sup>for the wind passes over it, and it is gone, and its place knows it no more. <sup>17</sup>But the steadfast love of the Lord is from everlasting to everlasting on those who fear him, and his righteousness to children's children, <sup>18</sup>to those who keep his covenant and remember to do his commandments.
