Psalm 77:1-20 (ESV) To the choirmaster: according to Jeduthun. A Psalm of Asaph. <sup>1</sup>I cry aloud to God, aloud to God, and he will hear me. <sup>2</sup>In the day of my trouble I seek the Lord; in the night my hand is stretched out without wearying; my soul refuses to be comforted. <sup>3</sup>When I remember God, I moan; when I meditate, my spirit faints. Selah <sup>4</sup>You hold my eyelids open; I am so troubled that I cannot speak. <sup>5</sup>I consider the days of old, the years long ago. <sup>4</sup>I said, "Let me remember my song in the night; let me meditate in my heart." Then my spirit made a diligent search: <sup>7</sup>"Will the Lord spurn forever, and never again be favorable? <sup>8</sup>Has his steadfast love forever ceased? Are his promises at an end for all time? <sup>9</sup>Has God forgotten to be gracious? Has he in anger shut up his compassion?" Selah <sup>10</sup>Then I said, "I will appeal to this, to the years of the right hand of the Most High." <sup>11</sup>I will remember the deeds of the Lord; yes, I will remember your wonders of old. <sup>12</sup>I will ponder all your work, and meditate on your might deeds. <sup>13</sup>Your way, O God, is holy. What god is great like our God? <sup>14</sup>You are the God who works wonders; you have made known your might among the peoples. <sup>15</sup>You with your arm redeemed your people, the children of Jacob and Joseph. Selah <sup>16</sup>When the waters saw you, O God, when the waters saw you, they were afraid; indeed, the deep trembled. <sup>17</sup>The clouds poured out water; the skies gave forth thunder; your arrows flashed on every side. <sup>18</sup>The crash of your thunder was in the whirlwind; your lightnings lighted up the world; the earth trembled and shook. <sup>19</sup>Your way was through the sea, your path through the great waters; yet your footprints were unseen. <sup>20</sup>You led your people like a flock by the hand of Moses and Aaron.
